

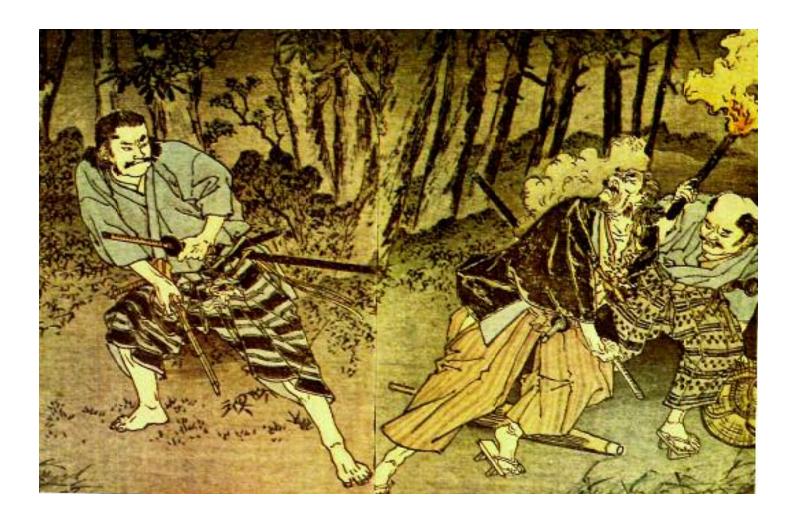

United States Ju-Jitsu Federation (USJJF) ® was established in 1971. Over the past 47

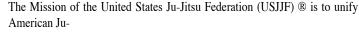
years, USJJF has provided multiple national training and certification pro-

USJJF members have participated in the North American Ju-Jitsu Union (NAJJU), the Panamerican Ju-Jitsu Federation (PJJF), the Ju-Jitsu International Federation (JJIF), the Asian Martial Arts Games (conducted by the Olympic Council of Asia), the International World Games Association (IW-GA), the World Ju-Jitsu Federation (WJJF), the World Ju-Jitsu Kobudo Organization (WJJKO), the World Council of Ju-Jitsu Organizations (WCJJO) and The Association For International Sport For All (TAFISA). USJJF has also organized, sponsored and sent USA JU-JITSU National Teams to compete in Continental and World Level Ju-Jitsu Championships.

Over the past 47 years, the USJJF has conducted many demonstrations, seminars, referee clinics and championships all to spread the growth of traditional & sport ju-jitsu in the USA. USJJF members have travelled to Canada, Mexico, Brazil, Uruguay, Spain, England, Germany, Italy, France, Sweden, Russia, Ireland, Kuwait and Scotland to participate in training camps and compete in championships.

Bruce R. Bethers, a Lieutenant Colonel (US Army retired), has 50 plus years of learning and teaching martial arts. He earned a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from Oklahoma University in 1972 and a Master's Degree in Business Management from Oklahoma City University in 1983. From 1978 - 1989, he was a Professional YMCA Director. He has served as the President of USJJF since 1999. 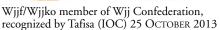

Next up is Frank Wörner. He holds a presentation on guns and revolvers. He

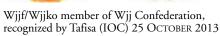

Thankfully the tatami are properly supported and absorb the shock of a fall almost completely. One is almost tempted to call it comfortable.

Finally, we line up. The people look drained yet satisfied with the work they put in today. Richard Schmidt, again, cuts it short. He recognizes that we are tired and feels no need to extend the farewell unnecessarily. The instructors are being thanked for their effort. Torsten Kosuch who has stepped down from the board is being rewarded for his duty with a tanto.

Then, very much to our surprise our president Francisco Boadella is being honoured with the 4. Dan and the title of Shidoin. Congratulations!

And as if that weren't already enough the whole swiss delegation is being beckoned to the front.

'The Secutor' returns to Ireland I spoke with Antonio la Salandra, "The Secutor", at dinner, after another very successful event at the Dojo, headquarters of WJJF Ireland. I was interested in knowing how he started in the martial arts ..

He started martial arts at the age of 4, when his grandfather took him to see Bruce Lee's movies in an old theatre, and soon his love for martial arts became evident.

His Mum took him to his first karate class. Very soon he was hooked.

Years passed and his mother worried because Antonio spent too much time in the gym. She thought he would neglect his studies, so she forbade him to continue (Antonio now has two doctor degrees and a high level university Masters). Antonio thus began to save his pocket money to pay for the hidden gym and the "Samurai" magazine that he loved to read - to keep up with the whole martial arts world. He said that as a boy he looked at Soke Clark, who developed the program, and Shike Bertoletti, whom he regards as instrumental in spreading the system around the world, and thought, "I want to be like that." In fact, Shike Bertoletti is still a great mentor and advisor to Anto-

> nio - staying so fresh and motivated for so many years in his career is a very difficult thing to achieve and Antonio has the utmost respect for him.

> When Antonio began to train very seriously, he asked his sensei if he could clean the dojo to earn his way and he even waited on tables in the evening to pay for his tuition. The road to progress was not easy and he had to work very hard and make many sacrifices in his personal life to support the level of commitment and training necessary to follow his passion.

Nevertheless, Antonio continued - training tirelessly and when kickboxing began to develop towards the end of the 80s, he decided to study the Full Contact discipline, landing the, then almost unknown, low

kickboxing titles, - becoming a 7 times Italian champion and 3 times European champion in the following years.

From here, he studied Thai Boxing and Brazilian Jiu Jitsu, earning the title of Kickboxing and Thai Boxing World Professional.

Antonio's philosophy is to study combat as a whole and get the best out of every system.

At this point in his life, Antonio has achieved the following:

In addition to being a Philippine Martial Arts Instructor, Jeet Kune Do Master, a Master in Thai Boxing, Kickboxing and a Shooting Instructor and CQB, he is currently the National Coordinator for Promotion Agencies recognized by the International Olympic Committee;

He is the European representative for the Brazilian Jiu Jitsu Academy of Rigan Machado. This led him to be designated as a Fight Consultant both in Italy and in the United States, where he trained many stunt men and actors and has his own academy.

He focused on the Israeli defence disciplines and, together with the Philippine Martial Arts (Kali), developed a specific training system for self-defence. This has begun to receive assignments from the boards of the CONI, the Italian government and the Italian and foreign police forces and, ultimately, he has gained recognition for this.

Antonio is very proud to have founded RAPID Training. A method based on human neurophysiology and growth reactions in the attack and defence phases. Founded in 2004, Pro Defensive Solutions ™ ASD offers training programs for law enforcement, military professionals and civilians

> However he manages to find the time, Antonio is still active in the Italian police force and holds the position of Chief Instructor of the Italian Police Academy (Rome), and is also a consultant of the Swiss Guard for the Pope.

> I mention all this first, because what we have discovered most of all is that Antonio shares the same belief that we do in WJJF Ireland - that belts

and titles are secondary to action. However, I would be amiss not to also mention these hard-earned accomplishments: WJJKO Ju Jitsu 7th grade -Brazilian Jiu Jitsu 4th grade - Full contact Karate 6th grade - ITF Tae Kwon Do 4th grade

As he quoted for us - more than once: "Perfect training leads to simplicity, imperfect training induces performance for aesthetic purposes."

Antonio trained with Soke Clark in his early days and has given the Federation a great deal of support since its collaboration agreement with Shike Bertoletti signed on July 2, 2014. He has traveled to various countries teaching many quality courses, including the countries of the Co-Chairmen.

We, in Ireland, attribute much of the success of our newly formed Grappling Committee to the support and input given by Antonio, and so, after another exceptional training weekend, it was with great pleasure that Kaicho David Toney, representing Shike Bertoletti and his Co-chairmen, presented a certificate of recognition of his 8th Dan degree, which was awarded to him by Kobushi Ryu.

The award was presented in the traditional style of Shike Bertoletti, to include the punch to the stomach, and the audience of students applauded in full appreciation of this well-deserved acknowledgement.

We look forward to many more collaborative courses with 'the Secutor' and Kaicho Toney will be on the mats as usual benefitting from the opportunity to train himself and gain new expertise. As he always says 'A lifetime of learning knows no end.'

Recognition

In most of today's federations there are black belts - kuro obi - with different degrees, different colours, but always practicing. The style schools, ryu ha, in Japan as in the rest of the world, have become, more or less, clubs for amateurs who even though they are good, they are always amateurs. Clubs form federations; the federations the continental structures (Europe, America, Australia, Asia and Oceania) and the latter to follow, the world ones. It can change the name of the federation but the final concept does not change. Because a group / a local structure enrolled in a larger organization, say in our case, the "Wjjf / Wjjko 1976" that with Dai Soke Robert Clark (1946-2012) we created in November 1976. For a recognition of one's professional work, technical experience, - the recognition of a degree is basic - which is always technical, - unless explicitly specified as honoris causa. Normally national federations fill a list of the deserving grades to be recognized, and send them to the world structure, because they issue the equivalent degree.

Some small variant for the 10th dan - ju dan - that certainly for the number of requests do not affect the bureaucratic work of the secretariats.

This is the case for example for the Ijf (International Judo Federation) and for the foundation "Kodokan", the house where the ancient way is practiced, wanted by Proff. Jigoro Kano (1860-1938).

If there were several general

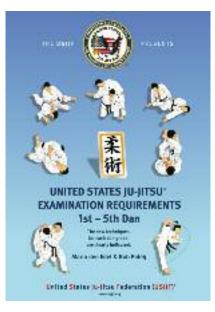

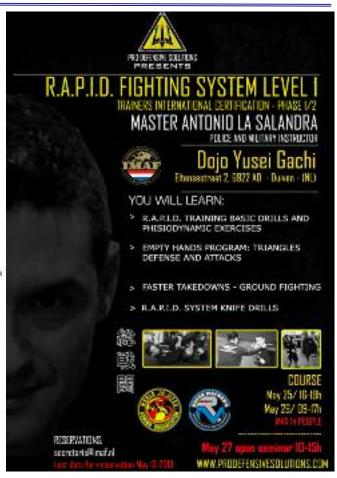
